

Since this report is the third publication and with information source being from numerous sectors, we expect there may be certain deficiencies in terms of coverage and updation. Background

Bumthang Dzongkhag, encompassing a total area of 2,667.76 Sq.Km with an altitude ranging from 2400-6000 meters above the sea level, has four Gewogs, namely Chhoekhor, Chhumey, Tang and Ura. It is bordered by China in the north, Mongar in the east, Zhemgang in the south and Trongsa in the west.

As per the Population and Housing Census of Bhutan (PHCB 2005), Bumthang Dzongkhag has 2,870 households and a total population of 16,116 out of which 11,913 live in the rural areas. The projected population for 2012 is 18,126.

A favorable terrain condition coupled with easy road accessibility has brought manifold changes in the socio-economic development of Bumthang. It is also considered as one of the prosperous Dzongkhags in the country.

The main source of income for the people of Bumthang are from potatoes, livestock farms and more recently tourism related activities. The sale of Cordyceps, Masutake and medicinal plants are also supplementing their income.

The Dzongkhag has a total road network of 317.175 Km including 124.000 Km of National Highway from Yotongla to Thrumshingla. It has a total of 19 Schools, out of which 11 are Community Primary Schools, 3 ECCD, 2 ECR, 1 Primary School, 2 Lower Secondary Schools, 3 Middle Secondary Schools and 2 Higher Secondary Schools with a total of 4,349 students and 257 teachers as of December 2012. It also has 24 NFE Centres and over 190 NFE Learners and 24 NFE Instructors. Ugyen Wangchuk Institute for Conservation and Environment and Chumey Institute for Civil Engineering with over 128 trainees and 22 teachers as of December 2012 are also located in Bumthang. It has one hospital and four BHUs.

As of 2012, it has a total of 16 mobile towers, out of which 7 towers are Bhutan Telecom and 9 mobile towers of Tashi Cell, Bumthang Dzongkhag have 100 percent coverage in all villages.

The Dzongkhag also has a mini-hydro power plant located at Chhumey Gewog supplying power to the local community.



Background

Chukha Dzongkhag was established in April 1987, coinciding with the beginning of the sixth plan. The Dzongkhag has one Drungkhag and 11 geogs Viz Sampheling, Bongo, Bjabchho, Chapchha, Darla, Dungna, Getena, Geling, Lokchina, Metakha and Phuentsholing.

Chukha is the main entry points for import and commercial hub of the country. Major hydro power plants, which are key source of national income, are also located in Chukha dzongkhag. This comparative advantage can foster rapid economic growth of the Dzongkhag

Chukha dzongkhag covers an area of about 1,802 sq.kilometers with elevations ranging from 200 to 3500m above sea level. Overall arable land forms only around 4.63% percent of the total area of the Dzongkhag with average landholding of 5.6 acres per household (Source gewog extension).

Majority of the people depend on livestock and subsistence agricultural farming. Mandarin, potatoes and cardamom are the principal cash crops in the Dzongkhag. Despite favorable climatic conditions, farm productivity is low due to terrain conditions and lack of adequate farm infrastructure in particular farm roads.

The dzongkhag has 43 schools including two private schools in Phuntsholing. Three hospitals and Nine BHUS render public health services in the dzongkhag. With 199 drinking water supply schemes, over 62 percent of the populations have access to piped drinking water supply.

Phuentsholing, Darla, Sampheling, Chapchha, Bongo and Bjabchho geogs have fairly good road network, electricity, water supply, health and education coverage with high income levels and good living conditions. Getena, Dungna, Metakha, Lokchina and Geling geogs on the other hand are very remote and relatively poor.

However motorable roads are under construction in those gewogs and soon the considerable problem in delivering developmental services to the people in these geogs will be overcome.



Background

Dagana Dzongkhag is located in the southern part of the country. It covers an area of 1389 Sq.Km, with an elevation ranging from 600 to 3800 meters above the sea level. About 83 percent of the Dzongkhag is under forest cover. It has a total projected population of 26,060, out of which 13,119 are male and 12,941 are female as of 2012. Dagana is bordered by Thimphu and Chukha Dzongkhag in the West, Wangdue Dzongkhag in the north, Tsirang Dzongkhag in the East and the Indian State of West Bengal in the South. The Dzongkhag falls within the temperate and sub-tropical zone with hot and wet summer and dry cold winter.

The Dzongkhag has one Dungkhag, that is, Lhamoizingkha and 14 Gewogs viz. Deorali, Lhamoizingkha, Nichula, Dorona, Drujegang, Gesarling, Goshi, Kana, Khebisra, Lajab, Tashiding, Tsendargang, Tsangkha and Tseza. The Dzongkhag has two constituencies viz. Drujeygang-Tseza Constituency and Lhamoizingkha-Tashiding Constituency. Most settlements are remote and do not have road connectivity. This combined with the rugged terrain makes the delivery of services difficult and costly. The Dzongkhag has 9 BHUs, 23 Schools supplemented by Extended Class Rooms and Out Reach Clinics. Agriculture farming is the main source of income of the Dzongkhag. The climatic conditions are favorable for growing different types of crops such as paddy, maize, millet, mandarin, cardamom, banana, passion fruit, pear, avocado, and vegetables such as broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, potato, chilies, and tomatoes. Dagana is a historically significant Dzongkhag in that it served as the seat of Daga Penlop and later as Daga Dzongpon for many years. It has many secret sites and monuments such as Daga Tashi Yangtsi, Do Namkhai Kaw, Do Kelpai Goenthey and Tha Namkhai Dzong, Do Phamai Nye, Do Dungchen Menchu, Do Dungkar and Wachen Nye .



Gasa

Background

Gasa Dzongkhag lies in the extreme northwest of the country. It is bordered by Punakha Dzongkhag towards southeast, Thimphu Dzongkhag in the southwest, Wangdue Phodrang Dzongkhag in the east and international boundary with Tibet Autonomous region of China. The Dzongkhag has an area of 3117.74 Sq Km, covering 11% of the total area of the whole country. The altitude ranges from 1500 to 4500 meters above sea level.

It experiences climate conditions ranging from temperate to alpine with extremely cold winters, and short and pleasant summers. During winters, upper Gasa, Laya and Lunana experience heavy snow fall which keep them snow bound as the mountain passes become inaccessible. It receives an average annual rainfall 2,000mm.

Initially, Gasa was a Dungkhag under Punakha Dzongkhag. In 1992 during the seventh Five Year Plan, it was upgraded and established as a separate Dzongkhag. Currently, the Dzongkhag is administratively supported by four Gewog namely Goenkhatoe, Goenkhamae, Laya and Lunana. Lunana is the furthest and most remote Gewog amongst the four. Gasa has a total of 3116 (PHCB, 05) registered population.

The people of Gasa generally speak Dzongkha with a distinctive accent. People of Laya and Lunana Gewogs also speak their local dialect and have their own unique dress.

The whole Dzongkhag falls under the Jigme Dorji National Park and is the habitat for different species of birds and animals like the takin, musk deer, blue sheep, snow leopard, red pandas, raven, wild pheasants, snow pigeons, red billed cough, Himalayan black bear, tiger, black necked crane etc. The Dzongkhag has about 33% its land area under forest cover, out of which about 35% is scrubs forest, 27% under fir forest, 15% under mixed conifer forest, 4% under broad leafed forest and the rest as tsamdro.

Gasa hold significant and strategic records in the history of Bhutan due to its relations and connections with the visit of Lama Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyel to Bhutan. Its relation as the patron and host to the unifier of Bhutan, Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyel earns it a special place and accord in the socio-political history of Bhutan.



Background

Haa Dzongkhag, encompassing a total area of 1899.02 Sq.Km with a population of little over 12,963 with an altitude ranging from 1000-5600 meters above the sea level,

The Dzongkhag is organizationally divided into one Thromdey and six Gewogs namely, Bje, Eusu, Kar-tshog, Samar, Sombaykha and Gakedling, Bbe gewog is the biggest and Kar-Tshog is the smallest in area wise. Due to hard physical barriers, Dzongkhag is administratively decentralized to one Drungkhag which is expected to address most of the constraint faced by the people of two Gewogs of Sombaykha and Gakedling.

Dzongkhag have one district judiciary court supported by its Drungkhag court, which caters all the legal related issues and discrepancies. One police station is located in the town led by Officer Commanding. Dzongkhag have financial institutes, BoB, BDBL and RICBL and good postal services.

The Dzongkhag is characterized by a craggy and mountainous terrain, and communities are located in remote settlements. The Dzongkhag is topographically divided into north and south. Bje, Kar-tshog, Eusu and Samar Gewogs lies in the north while two Gewogs Gaykedling and Sombaykha which are separated from north by Tergola and Selela pass.

Haa is one of the least populated Dzongkhag after Gasa. The vegetation ranges from broad leafed forest in the southern Gewogs to coniferous and sub alpine in the central, and pure alpine vegetation in the high lands of the northern Gewogs. The Dzongkhag is endowed with very rich flora and fauna and about 74% of the Dzongkhag is under forest cover. The Dzongkhag have widespread of flower called "white poppy", which is endemic to Haa only that magnetize the tourist.

It has cold and dry winters and wet and warm summers. In winters, the temperature drops down to minus seven degree Celsius at the extreme minimum. The Dzongkhag receives snow fall several times in a year from late November till early March.

Haa being located in very high altitude, the cultivatable agricultural land constitutes only around 2 % of the total area of the Dzongkhag. Since the Dzongkhag is constrained by the prolonged winter and short growing seasons. Most of the Gewogs own dry land areas and pasture lands. Majority of the people depend on livestock, forest product and business. Livestock rearing constitute an important economic activity in the Dzongkhag, with a preponderance of the northern Gewogs depending on livestock products such as butter, cheese and yak meat for their livelihood. Wheat is the main cereal crop grown in the Dzongkhag, and other crop includes barley and buckwheat. In the south cardamom and ginger constitutes the principal cash crops

and supported by oranges and in north potato serves as main cash crops, while apples and vegetables are also cultivated on a moderate scale.

The Dzongkhag has good education coverage with one higher secondary school, three Lower secondary schools, three primary schools three community schools and four extended Class Rooms with total enrollments of 3258 students in 2012.

The Dzongkhag does not have full-fledged district hospital at the moment and the plans are on the move to construct. Therefore, the Bali BHU-I functions as the Dzongkhag Hospital with a Doctor, DMO (Dzongkhag Medical Officer) supported by 4 BHUs Graded II. Some cases are also referred to IMTRAT military hospital, rendering public health services in the Dzongkhag.

Bje, Kar-tshog, Eusu and northern part of Samar Gewogs are within radius of 15 Kilometers from Dzongkhag administration and have fairly good road network and other Facilities like electricity, telephones connection, water supply, health and education coverage with better living conditions. Sombaykha and Gaykedling Gewog on the other hand are very remote and very relatively poor. It will take four and five days official walk to reach Gewog centers and tends scatters settlements, rugged terrain and lack of motor-able roads pose considerable problem in delivering developmental services to the peoples of those Gewogs, we are expected to have road network connecting two Gewog offices latest by end of 2013, however all the villages has full coverage of Mobile facilities, Tashi cell infocom and B. Moile.

In 2002, subsequent to the 79th session of the National Assembly, the valley was opened to foreign tourism. With the cultural sites of 40 lakhangs, which are owned by Government, Community and private individual.



Background

Lhuentse Dzongkhag, encompassing a total area of 2,847 Sq.Km with an altitude ranging from 600 - 5800 meters above the sea level, has eight Gewogs, namely Gangzur, Jarey, Kurtoe, Khoma, Menbi, Minjey, Metsho and Tsengkhar. It is bordered by China in the north, Mongar in the south, Tashiyangtsi in the east south and Bumthang in the west.

As per the PHCB 2005, Lhuentse has 3001 households and a total population of 15395 out of which 13919 live in the rural areas. The projected population for 2012, based on PHCB 2005, is 16980.

The Dzongkhag has a total of 30 Schools, out of which 16 are Community Primary Schools, 6 Primary School, 2 Lower Secondary Schools, 2 Middle Secondary Schools 1 Higher Secondary Schools and 4 early learning centers (ERC) with a total of 3862 students and 209 teachers as of December 2011. It also has 58 NFE Centres and over 478 NFE Learners and 55 NFE Instructors.



Background

Mongar Dzongkhag is 450 km east of Thimphu, the capital city of Bhutan. It lies between 27.25° latitude and 91.2° longitude. It has an area of about 1,947 sq.km with elevation ranging from 400-4000 meters above sea level. The lower and southern parts are sub tropical while northern and higher regions have temperate climatic conditions. Summer can be hot and humid and winter cold.

The Dzongkhag is enclaved by Trashigang, Lhuntshe, Pemagatshel, Samdrup Jongkhar, Zhemgang and Bum-thang Dzongkhags. The kuri chhu, Sheri chhu and Dangme chhu are important rivers in the Dzongkhag.

For Administrative prospers, the Dzongkhag is divided in to 17 gewogs and a Drungkhang located at Weringla to cover the two Gewogs of Gongdue and Slambi. The other Gewogs are Balam, Chali, Chaskar, Dramitse, Drepong, Jurmey, Kengkhar, Mongar, Narang, Ngat-shang, Saleng, Sherimung, Thangrong, Tsakaling and Tsamang. The population is estimated at 41,386 with male and female almost equally divided.

While maize and rice are grown abundantly, citrus fruits and vegetables, dairy and poultry products are increasingly becoming important sources of cash income.

The Dzongkhag has 63.5 km of feeder roads, 309 km of farm road, and 92.2 km of power tiller tracks. The east west National Highway passes through the heart of the Dzongkhag.

The dzongkhag has 51 School (50 Government and 1 private) with more than 10,000 students, 1 Regional Re-ferral Hospital, 22 Basic Health Units (BHU's) and more than 50 Outreach Clinics (ORC's). There are also 17 Renewable Natural Resources Extension Center (RNR) and one Renewable Natural Resources Research and Development Center located at Wengkhar.





Background

Paro Dzongkhag, encompassing a total area of 1,293.2 Sq.Km with an altitude 2500 meters above the sea level, has ten Gewogs, namely Dogar, Dopshari, Doteng, Hungrel, Lamgong, Luni, Naja, Shaba, Tsento and Wangchang. It is bordered by China in the North, Thimphu dzongkhag in the east, Haa Dzongkhag in the west and Chhukha dzongkhag in the south.

As per the PHCB 2005, Paro has 7,118 households and a total population of 36,433 out of which 33,501 live in the rural areas. The projected population for 2012, based on PHCB 2005, is 41,174.

A favorable terrain condition coupled with easy road accessibility has brought manifold changes in the socio-economic development of Paro. It is also considered as one of the prosperous Dzongkhag in the country.

The main source of income for the people of Paro are from paddy, apples, vegetables, livestock farms and tourism related activities. The sales of Cordyceps in the northern part of Tsento gewog are also supplementing their income.

The Dzongkhag has a total road network of 438Km including 139.4Km of National Highway and 262Km of Farm roads. It has one hospital, three BHUs and 27 Outreach Clinic. It has a total of 23 Schools, out of which three are Community Primary Schools, three Primary Schools, six Lower Secondary Schools, four Middle Secondary Schools, two Higher Secondary Schools and six private schools (one primary and five higher secondary Schools) with a total of 12,143 students and 567 teachers as of December 2012.

It also has 21 NFE Centers and 300 NFE Learners and 21 NFE Instructors. The Paro College of Education has 944 trainees and 62 teachers as of 31st October 2012.

As of September 2012, a total of 1,800 households have direct fixed telephone line connections and 37,581 B-mobile subscribers. The only international airport in the country is located in Paro Dzongkhag.

We hope that this report will serve as a source of information and guiding tool for micro-level planning and decision-making in the Dzongkhag. Statistics office, Pemagatshel would like to thank and acknowledge the support and cooperation of all sector heads concerned for providing timely information for this report. Without their support, this publication would not have been possible. Through this initiative, we also hope that the maintenance of sectoral information and updation in the Dzongkhag will become more systematic and efficient henceforth.

Since this report is the third publication and with information source being from numerous sectors, we expect there may be certain deficiencies in terms of coverage and updattion. However, there will be continuous efforts made to improve its coverage and quality in our future publications. Your comments and suggestions in this regard will be highly appreciated.

Background

Pemagatshel declared as separate Dzongkhag after 1974 from Monger Dzongkhag. This Dzongkhag covers an area of about 1030.04 Sq.Km with an elevation ranging from 1000-3500 meters above the sea level. The Dzongkhag has 54% of forest coverage and about 45% of land cultivates area. It has eleven Gewogs, namely, Chhimoong, Chhoekhorling, Chongshig, Dechhenling,Dungmaed,Khar, Nanong, Norboogang, Shumar,Yurung and Zobel. It Shares border of Tashigang on north & north-east, Mongar on north-west, Zhemgang on west & Samdrup Jongkhar on south & south-east.

Pemagatshel has 56 Chiwogs and 157 villages as per the Bhutan election boundary describes. There are total 5,344 households; 501 house hold of urban and 4,843 house hold at rural in 2012. The total Projected population of this Dzongkhag as per PHCB 2005 is 24,363; 12,036 are males and 12,362 are females in 2012. The population density is 24 Persons per Sq. Km. There are 268 protected water schemes in the Dzongkhag to facilities drinking water.

Within 10th FYP, the most of the Gewog/villages road are connected and this accessibility has brought manifold changes in the socio-economic development of Pemagatshel.

The Dzongkhag has moderate climatic condition and quite hot at lower altitude in summer.

Most of the cultivated land is under Tseri cultivation. The maize is the main cereals crops of this Dzongkhag. Other crops like oranges, potatoes, and subtropical fruits and vegetables are cultivated in most of villages. The main sources of income

for the people of Pemagatshel are from; Agriculture, livestock and small scale business on consumer items.

The gypsum mining and the gypsum power factory at Khothakpa under Shumar Gewog provide employment for unskilled laborers during off season. This mining industry also contributes sustainable revenue to the government of Bhutan.

Pemagatshel total road network of 281 Km including 23 Km of Primary highway road from Tshelinghor to Pemagatshel (Market). It has a total of 31 Schools, out of which 2 are Higher Secondary School ,1 is Middle Secondary School, 6 are Lower Secondary school, 22 are Community Primary Schools There are 37 NFE Centers and over 571 NFE Learners and 37 NFE Instructors. It has one hospital, 12 BHUs, 3 Indigenous units.

As of 2012, there are 245 households with internet access, 517 household are connected with fixed telephone line and all the Gewog are accessible to mobile services.
