

Background

PunakhaDzongkhag has a total area of 1108.26 sq. Km. TheDzongkhag consists of eleven Geogs, namely: Chhubu, Dzomi, Goenshari, Guma, Kabjisa, Lingmukha, ShengaBjimi, Talo, Toewang, Barb and Toep. The temperature varies from 35 degree Celsius during summers to 13 degree Celsius during winters. It receives an average annual rainfall of 83 mm. The altitude of the Dzongkhag ranges from 1200 metres to 4800 metres.

The projected population of the Dzongkhagfor the year 2011 is 26, 541 which consists of 13,424 male and 13,117 female.

The dzongkhag has total forest coverage of about 87,978 hectares, out of which 30% is Coniferous forest, 42% is Broad-leaved, scrub forest is 2% and pasture is 3%. 22% of the total area is cultivable land.

The main cereal crops grown in the Dzongkhag are paddy, wheat, maize, and mustard. Fruits such as Persimmon, Guavas, Peaches, Plums, Pears and even Sub-tropical Apples are grown here.but citrus fruits being the main fruits grown in the Dzongkhag.The vegetables like Chilies, Raddish, Cabbages, Brinjals, Green leaved vegetables and Tomatoes are also cultivated. Dzongkhag also has a relatively good network of feeder and farm roads that provide easy access to market.

The Dzong which is located at the confluence of Phochu and Mochu rivers was built by ZhabdrungNgawangNamgyel in 1637. It was named as PungthangDechenPhodrangDzong and had been the winter capital until 1955. It is now the winter residence of the Je Khenpo and the Central Monk Body. The Machey (Sacred embalmed body) of ZhabdrungNgawangNamgyal is preserved and guarded with great devotion and reverence in the MacheyLhakhang. The PunakhaDzong has always been an attraction for tourists because of its rich historical background.

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

Background

Samtse Dzongkhag lies in the South Western part of Bhutan bordered by Chukha Dzongkhag in the east, Ha Dzongkhag in the north and Indian State of West Bengal and Sikkim in the south and west respectively. The Dzongkhag has a total area of approximately 1309.1 Sq. Km. The major portion of the Dzongkhag falls within the sub-tropical belt with elevations ranging from 200-3500 meters above sea level.

The Dzongkhag Administration unit comprises of 2 Dungkhags namely; Dorokha and Sipsu and has 15 Gewogs viz; Biru (Pemaling), Bara (Norgaygang), Chargaharey (Sang-Ngag-Chholing), Chengmari (Norboogang), Denchukha, Dorokha (Dophoogchen), Dungtoe (Dungtoed), Ghumaunay (Yoseltse), Lahereni (Namgaycholing), Pagli (Phuentshopleri), Samtse, Sipsu (Tashicholing), Tading, Tendu & Ugyentse.

The Drungkhag Administration Office and Gewog centers are connected with telecommunication facilities. Existence of such infrastructures and with normalization of security situation, the Dzongkhag has significantly improved its socio-economic development.

With large fertile plain area, rich mineral deposits and sub-tropical climate, the Dzongkhag has high potential for agricultural and economic activities. A favorable terrain condition coupled with construction of new roads has brought manifold changes in the socio-economic development of Samtse. It is considered as one of the prosperous Dzongkhags in the Country. The main source of income of the people of this Dzongkhag is from cash crops like cardamom, oranges, ginger and areca nut.

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

BACKGROUND

The Sarpang Dzongkhag is situated in the central southern foothills bordering India. The area of the Dzongkhag stretches from Phipsoo wildlife sanctuary in the west to Manas National Park in the east. The Dzongkhag shares about 200 km of common border with the Indian state of Assam to the south and the Dzongkhags of Tsirang and Dagana to the west, Zhemgang to the east and Trongsa to the north. It encompasses a total geographical area of approximately 1666 Sq.km. Its topographical features have undulated terrain with an elevation ranging from 200m to 3600m above mean sea level.

The Sarpang Dzongkhag is administratively supported by a Gelephu Dungkhag and consists of 12 Gewogs. Services and administrative support for five Gewogs, Gakiling (Hilley), Dekiling, Singye, Chhudzom (Dovan) and Shompangkha are provided from Dzongkhag headquarter. While seven Gewogs namely, Gelephu, Chuzargang, Umling, Sershong, Taraythang, Jigmechoeling and Samtenling (Bhur) are provided by Gelephu Drungkhag.

The Sarpang Dzongkhag has 61chiwogs (LG Election) with 7346 households and 37191 populations (PHCB, 2005).

Paddy, maize, wheat, and millet are some of the major crops cultivated in the Dzongkhag. Orange, areca nut, cardamom and ginger are grown as principal cash crops by the farmers of the Dzongkhag.

Favourable terrain and climatic conditions combined with fertile agriculture land offer tremendous opportunity for farm mechanization and commercial horticultural development.

Background

Thimphu is the capital city of Bhutan. It lies in the Western part of Bhutan bordering with Gasa and Punakha Dzongkhags in the east, Chukha and Dagana in the south, Paro Dzongkhag in the west and Tibet (China) in the north.

The Dzongkhag Administration unit comprises of 1 Dungkhags i.e. Lingzhi and has 8 Gewogs viz; Chang, Dagala, Geneykha, Kawang, Mewang, Lingzhi, Naro, Soe. The 3 Gewogs viz; Lingzhi, Soe, Naro falls under Lingzhi Dungkhag Administration. It has many important historical, cultural and religious heritage sites.

Thimphu Dzongkhag is also considered as one of the developed Dzongkhags in the country. The lower part of Dzongkhags has as easy access to National Referral hospital, national research centre, central ministries, agriculture related corporations and the financial institutions. With the capital being located in the Dzongkhag, it is predominant economic and trading hub for the western region. Therefore, it provides large domestic market for the agricultural and livestock products.

An extension services such as agriculture, livestock and forestry are available in all gewogs. The Dzongkhag had reduced agricultural land use due to urbanization. Rapid growth rates in rural-urban migration has resulted the increase in unemployment and population of the Thimphu City.

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
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Preface

The Annual Dzongkhag Statistics of Trashigang is the third in the series of publications. It attempts to provide comprehensive statistics of Trashigang Dzongkhag and will be published annually.

The report contains statistics on demographic and socio-economic, environment, culture, local governance and infrastructures of the Dzongkhag. The statistical data for this publication are collected and compiled from various sectors and through primary sources.

Background

Trashigang Dzongkhag has bordered by Mongar Dzongkhag in the west, Samdrup Jongkhar and Pemagatshel Dzongkhag in the South, Trashi Yangtse Dzongkhag in the north and Indian state of Aranachal Pradesh in the east. Trashigang is one of the largest Dzongkhag in the Kingdom with total area about 2204 Sq. Km (Land Mapping & Classification Project 2010). In 2012 the projected population for the Dzongkhag is 54,036. Dangme chu, which is one of the largest river in the country passes through the Dzongkhag. The elevation ranges from 600 m to over 4500 m above sea level. The climate is mainly temperate with an annual rainfall between 1000 mm and 2000 mm.

Trashigang Dzongkhag has three Drungkhags (namely Sagteng, Wamrong and Thrimshing) and fifteen geogs, namely; Bartsham, Bidoong, Kanglung, Kangpar, Khaling, Lumang, Merag, Phongmed, Radhi, Sagteng, Samkhar, Shongphoog, Thrimshing, Udzorong and Yangnyer.

The Dzongkhag has 10 Early Child Care & Development Centres, 9 Extended Classroom, 31 Community Primary Schools, 10 Primary Schools, 10 Lower Secondary Schools, 5 Middle Secondary Schools, 4 Higher Secondary Schools with total students of 12,615 in 2012 and 1 National Institute for the Visually Impaired, 1 Rangjung Institute of Electrical Engineering, 1 Draksho Vocational Training Centre and 1 tertiary education center (Sherubtse College) which sum up to 83 schools/institutes. There are 3 hospitals (including IMTART, RBA), 24 Basic Health Unit (both grade I & II), 3 sub posts and 57 out reach clinics rendering public health and 95.38 % of the population has access to safe drinking water supply. The 5 satellite towns and 458 villages of all 15 Gewogs has an access to electricity with the electricity coverage of 95.19% of which total consumer of 10,469 and 87 households with solar light. The Rural Telecom Coverage of 98.39% with B-mobile & T-Cell connecting all Gewogs. The totals length of 812.54 Km with road network coverage of 72.61 % (1 hour walking distance from nearest access road) of which 111.0 Km national highways, 161.48 Km district roads, 8.9 Km urban roads, 492.76 Km farms roads and power tiller tracks, 8.5 Km forest roads and 29.9 Km of access (approach) roads.

Trashigang dzong was built in 1659 by Trongsa Penlop, Chogyel Minjur Tempa (1659-1676 AD, the 3rd Deb of Bhutan). The dzong was then named as Trashigang, "the Fortress of the Auspicious Mountain". The dzong was expended by Tenzin Rabgye, 4th Desi of Bhutan (1680-1694) and restored it around 1950 by Dasho Dopola,

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Trashigang Dzongpon. During 1960s and 1970s late Lyonpo Tamzhing Jagar (then the Nyerchen of Trashigang), Dasho Kuenzang Tangbi, then Dzongdag of Trashigang carried out some repairs and changed the shingle roofing with asbestos sheet .

The dzong has 8 different Lhakhangs and these are Lam Lhakhang in the central tower which is dedicated to Shabdrung Rimpochhe, the Tshechu Lhakhang with Guru Tshengye, the Goenkhang dedicated to deities Mahakala and Mahakali, the Dupthob Lhakhang for Dupthob Thangthong Gyalpo and other great Buddhist saints, the Kuenray Lhakhang, the Tshokshing Lhakhang which has the lineage of Drukpa, Karmapa, Nyingmapa and Zogchen displayed and the Dema Lhakhang with 21 kinds of Demas.

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

Background

Trashiyangtse Dzongkhag was created in year 1992, coinciding with the beginning of the seventh Five Year Plan from Trashigang Dzongkhag. It has a total area of 1437.8 Sq.Km with an altitude ranging from 500-5400 meters above the sea level, has Eight Gewogs, namely Bumdeling, Jamkhar, Khamdang, Ramjar, Toetsho, Tongzhang, Yalang and yangtse. The Dzongkhag has borders with Trashigang and Mongar Dzongkhag in the south, Lhuntse Dzongkhag in the west, the India state of Arunachal Pradesh in the east, and Tibetan Autonomous Region of China in North.

As per the PHCB 2005, Trashiyangtse has 3490 households and a total population of 19951 out of which 14722 live in the rural areas. The projected population for 2011 based on PHCB 2005, is 19951.

Trashiyangtse is known for traditional handcraft like wooden bowl ("Dapa") and Daphne ("Desho") production which is the main source of income for quite a large number of people in Yangtse and Bumdeling Geog. Near the border with china, Trashiyangtse is endowed with Cordceps(Chinese Caterpillar) at the pastoral areas which fetches very high price through export.

Agriculture farming integrated with livestock production is the main source of livelihood for majority of population although some pastoral settlements exist in the north of Bumdeling geog. Rice, Maize, Millet, Buckwheat and Wheat are the major cereal crops grown in the dzongkhag. In-fact, Trashiyangtse produces early chili. Of late dairy cooperatives, backyard Poultry farms and Piggery farms, and Vegetable growers groups are established to supply these products to Schools and public

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market. Cornflake, rice and maize machines and oil-expeller are introduced to ease process the produce and generate their rural income.

Trashiyangtse has a total road network of 154.531 Km including 44 Km of National Highway from Chazam to Yangtse. It has a total of 30 Schools, out of which 21 are Community Primary Schools, 7 Lower Secondary Schools, 1 Middle Secondary Schools and 1 Higher Secondary Schools with a total of 5617 students and 227 teachers as of October, 2011. It also has 21 NFE Centres and over 359 NFE Learners and 17 NFE Instructors. One Zorig chusum with over 122 trainees and 17 teachers as of October 2011, are also located in Yangtse. It has one hospital and four BHUs.

As of 2012, a total of 184 households have access to direct fixed telephone line and 8700 mobile subscribers.

It has scared monument like chorten Kora in Yangtse, which was built by Lam Ngawang Loday of Rigsum Goenpa to subdue the local Demons and Gomphu Kora. Yangtse Dzong accommodates Dzongkhag staff and Drangthrim office while the old Dzong accommodates Dratshang.

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
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Preface

Since this report is the second publication and with information source being from numerous sectors, we expect there may be certain deficiencies in terms of coverage and updation. However, there will be continuous efforts made to improve its coverage and quality in our future publications. Your comments and suggestions in this regard will be highly appreciated.

Background

Yongzin Ngagi Wangchuk who was guided, in a vision, by the guardian deity, Palden Lhamo, to visit a place in the central Bhutan which resembled a bow and which was in food grains (mang-dru) where the name Mangdue has its origin, arrived in Trongsa in 1541 where he took residence in the village of Yueli. One night while Yongzin Ngagi Wangchuk was meditating, his attention was drawn by a flicker of light, resembling that of butter lamp burning in the open air, at the spot where the present day Goenkhang of the Trongsa Dzong is located. In 1543, he established a small Tshamkhang (meditation quarter) in the sacred spot and meditated there. He soon attracted a number of disciples who built their own meditation unit around the main Tshamkhang. The cluster of newly built meditation quarters appeared to the people of Yueli above like a new village and hence they called it "Trongsa" meaning "new village".

Trongsa dzongkhag is located in the heart of the country. It covers an area of about 1807 km², with elevation ranging from 800 meters to 4,800 meters above sea level with a total population of about 15,240(estimated) in 2012 with the growth rate of 1.4%. As per the PHCB 2005, Trongsa has 2,739 households and a total population of 13,419 out of which 10,724 live in the rural areas. It shares boundaries with Bumthang dzongkhag to the northeast, Wangdiphodrang dzongkhag to the west and Zhemgang dzongkhag to the south.

Despite formidable rugged terrain in most part of the dzongkhag, the blacked topped East-West highway and the Trongsa-Gelephu highway passes through the dzongkhag connecting almost all the gewogs, which serves as the main economic artery.

Though the East-West and Trongsa-Gelephu highway passes through the dzongkhag, most settlements are still remote due to lack of feeder roads. This combined with the rugged terrain makes delivery of services difficult and costly. Still, every Gewog in the dzongkhag have a BHU, RNR centers and a School each providing basic services, where it is further supplemented by Community Primary Schools and Out Reach Clinic.

Trongsa dzongkhag consists of five geogs namely, (i). Drakteng (ii). Korphu (iii). Nubi (iv). Langthil and (v). Tangsibji. Nubi geog is the most densely populated geog of the dzongkhag. With the political change in the country the dzongkhag is further divided in two Constituencies. 1) Nubi Tangsibji and 2) Drakteng Langthil.

Agriculture farming is the main source of income for majority of the population and farmers grow almost all kinds of crops. Trongsa is one of the, historically and ecologically extremely important and fragile dzongkhag in the Kingdom. Trongsa Dzong was headquartering eastern region and have been the seat of Trongsa Penlop. Even today, every Crown Prince of Bhutan has to be formally investiture as a Trongsa Penlop before becoming the hereditary King of Bhutan.

There are many sacred monuments like tapering rock in Nubji lakhang, Kubra,Ugen Drak and Phumzur lhakhang, which are all believed that Guru Padmasambhava have visited and meditated in this sacred sites on his way back from Bumthang to India in 8th century. Very few people excluding the local people visit these sacred sites because of inadequate road facilities. The other sacred spots in Trongsa are Ta-Dzong, and Trongsa Dzong that lulls immense attraction of tourist.

Jigme Singye Wangchuck National Park that covers an area of 1730 km² is a home for many globally endangered rare floras and fauna of the country, and it's a habitual place for one of the most globally endangered species Golden Langur. The National Park was established in 1995 in order to protect large area of virtually untouched ecosystem ranging from mixed conifer in the north to chirepine / broadleaf forest in the south.

Opening of Eco-tourism foot trial from Langthil to Korphu through Jangbi village have open door to tourist which is an additional source of income for the people of Langthil and Korphu geog.

The Monpas, who are believed to be the true native, resides on the lower parts of the Langthil and Korphu gewog which falls under the Jigme Singye Wangchuck National Park. Monkha is their native dialect and they depend upon forest resource for their daily needs. The monpa of Wangling, Jangbi and Phumzur are homogenous and close community. They live and work in groups. Joint family system of living is still prevalent in these villages.

The Mangduechhu River flows through the heart of the dzongkhag dividing the Dzongkhag almost into two half's. This dzongkhag enjoys a mixed climate, that is, warm humid and warm temperate with soil type sandy loam and clayey loam. The topography is rugged with deep gorges to the north and steep slope in the south.

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
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Preface

Background

Tsirang Dzongkhag, encompassing a total area of 638.8 Sq.Km with an altitude ranging from 400-3600 meters above the sea level, has twelve Gewogs, namely Barshong, Patshaling, Dunglagang, Gosaling, kikorthang, Mendrelgang, Sergithang, Phuentenchu, Rangthangling, Semjong, Tsholingkhar and Tsirangtoe. It is located along the Wangdue Phodrang - Sarpang National High way, making it easy access to business opportunities. All twelve gewogs are connected with road network.

As per the PHCB 2005, Tsirang has 3,651 households and a total population of 18,667 out of which, 17,001 live in the rural areas. The projected population for 2012, based on PHCB 2005, is 20,894.

A favorable terrain condition coupled with easy road accessibility has brought manifold changes in the socio-economic development of Tsirang. It is also considered as one of the prosperous Dzongkhags in the country.

The main source of income for the people of Tsirang are from citrus, poultry products, livestock farms, and more recently the organic-farming has become very popular with suitable climate and through the initiatives of RNR sectors. Vegetables are being sold to nearby districts; Sarpang and Thimphu.

All the gewogs are connected with electricity and Mobile services, changing the lifestyles of rural people, which may have very good impact on rural urban migration. Seven gewogs already have community information centres built and soon rest of the gewogs will have the community information centers in their gewogs, making the lives of rural people easy access for information and communication technology.

Indeed, the Dzongkhag is moving in line with its Vision,"An Economically Vibrant, Culturally Rich, Organic Dzongkhag with Peaceful and Knowledgeable Society Co-existing in Perpetual Harmony with the Pristine Environment".

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

Background

Zhemgang Dzongkhag has a total land area of 2421.74 km² with one Drungkhag viz. Panbang and eight Gewogs namely; Bardo, Bjoka, Goshing, Nangkor, Ngangla, Phangkhar, Shingkhar and Trong. For administrative convenience, the Drungkhag administration at Panbang looks after the four southern Gewogs viz; Bjoka, Goshing, Ngangla and Phangkhar.

Zhemgang is considered as one of the least developed Dzongkhags in the country. Most of its Gewogs are still not connected with the road network. Dzongkhag is divided into three ecological zones namely Upper Kheng, Middle Kheng and Lower Kheng. The livelihood for the people of the Kheng depends on agriculture and livestock farming. In recent years, mandarin cultivation in Lower Kheng as a source of cash income has been quite encouraging. However, the transportation has been the biggest hurdle for any business or developmental activities to be undertaken.

The forest covers 86 percent of the total area of the Dzongkhag. Zhemgang is also known for Royal Manas Park, which has been declared as one the ten internationally recognized "Hot Spot" areas. The Dzongkhag shares the boundaries with Royal Manas Park and other protected areas under Jigme Singye Wangchuck and Thrimshingla National Parks.

The existence problems such as levels of illiteracy, infant and maternal mortality, shortage of skilled and unskilled manpower, limited arable land, limited accessibility to market and out-migration of youth and educated population exacerbated the situation.
