The National Statistics Bureau (NSB) is pleased to release the **Producer Price Index (PPI)** Bulletin for the first quarter (January-March), 2016. This is the 13th series of PPI bulletin published by the Bureau.

The PPI is a measure of average price change of goods and services over time. It measures price change from producer's perspective unlike the Consumer Price Index (CPI) which measures the price change from the purchaser's perspective.

Bhutan's PPI covers logging, mining and quarrying, manufacturing, utilities (electricity and water), transport and communication sectors. It covers domestically produced goods and services.

The NSB would like to express its sincere gratitude to all government agencies, private companies and corporations for providing the data for the publication of this bulletin. We look forward to your continued support and co-operation in future as well.

## Highlights

### Year-on-Year inflation

The year-on-year (YoY) inflation rate (as measured by PPI) for January, February and March as compared to the same months of the previous year is recorded at 1.78%, 0.72% and % respectively. On average this is an increase of **1.40%** from the first quarter of the previous year (i.e. 2015).

The logging sector which had the highest increase has contributed significantly to the overall increase with an average monthly increase of 17.04%. While Mining and Quarrying sector recorded an increase by 4.75%, 3.84% and 4.10% in January, February and March respectively, the Manufacturing sector increased in all three months by 2.18% on an average. Transport sector decreased by 0.76% on an average. There was no change recorded in the Electricity and Gas, Water Supply and Information and Communication sector.

### Month-to-month inflation

The month-to-month inflation decreased in two consecutive months January and February by 0.05% and 1.20% and recorded an increase of 0.97% in March.

The index for Mining and Quarrying increased by 0.62% on an average. Manufacturing sector recorded 0.13% and 2.49% decrease in January and February respectively, while it increased in March by 1.82%. Transport sector increased by 0.06% on average. Prices remained same for Logging, electricity, water supply and Information & communication sector for all the three months.

The drop in index for the month of January and February by 0.05% and 1.20% respectively was due to corresponding decrease in the manufacturing sector and mining and quarrying sector.






**Graph 1: Time series of monthly Producer Price Index (PPI)**

## Technical Note

### Definition

Producer Price Index (PPI) is the measure of average change over time in the prices received by the domestic producer of goods and services. It shows the average change in the prices goods and services with reference to a particular reference period known as Index reference.

### Scope and Coverage

The PPI covers domestic produced goods and services that are destined for domestic as well as export market. The sectors included are logging, mining and quarrying, manufacturing, utilities (electricity and water), transport and communication sector. PPI is classified and compiled by activity (ISIC rev. 4) and also by product (CPC rev. 2).

### Weights

Weights denote the significance or relative importance of each level or group to the total. PPI weights are developed using the total value of turnover figure from the establishment census 2010 by the Ministry of Labor and Human Resource and also the data collected on turnover of each establishment by the National Statistics Bureau.

### Index Reference

The index reference for the calculation of the PPI is the September, 2011 which is normally set as 100.

### Price Collection

Point-in-time prices are collected for the PPI compilation i.e. price of a product on the 15th day of every month or the nearest trading day to the 15th of the month.

### Index calculation methodology

Geometric Modified Laspeyre's formula is used for compiling PPI

$$P_{gyo} = \prod_{i=1}^n \left( \frac{P_i^t}{P_i^0} \right)^{w_i^b}$$

## Uses of PPI

1. As deflator in National Accounts to estimate the real growth rate
2. As lead indicator of inflationary trends
3. Indexation of cost escalation in long term contract of goods and services
4. Business analysis
5. Current cost accounting

## Calculating Index Changes

Movement of Price index from one month to another is usually expressed in term of percent changes, rather than as changes in index points. Index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period, whereas percent changes are not. The following example shows the computation of index point and percent changes.

### *Index point change*

All industries Price Index	104.50
Less previous price index	101.25
Equals index point change	3.25

### *Index percent change*

Index point change	3.25
Divided by Previous Price Index	101.25
Equals	0.032
Result multiplied by 100	0.032 x 100
Equals percent changes	3.2

If the data are not received on time from the sources, the index published for that particular quarter will be marked as “Provisional” and this will be finalized when the next quarter index is published.
