





Background

Thimphu is the capital of Bhutan, encompassing a total area of 2,067 Sq.Km with an altitude 2320m/7656ft. Thimphu Dzongkhag has one Dungkhag and eight Gewogs, namely Chang, Dagala, Kawang, Gyeney, Lingshi, Naro and Soe.

It shares boundaries with Wangdue & Punakha Dzongkhags in the east, Chukha & Dagana in the south, Paro Dzongkhag in the west. In the north, it borders the Tibetan Autonomous Region of China.

As per the PHCB 2005, Thimphu has total population of 98,676 out of which 19,491 live in the rural areas. The projected population for 2011, based on PHCB 2005, is 106,568.

A favorable terrain condition coupled with easy road accessibility has brought manifold changes in the socio-economic development of Thimphu. It is also considered as one of the developed Dzongkhag in the country.

The main source of income for the people of Thimphu is from Agricultural product like potatoes, Chilli, livestock farms and Cordyceps for people of three Geogs of Lingzhi Dungkhag.

The Dzongkhag has total of 117.2 Km of National Highway. It has total of 12 Schools under the Dzongkhag Administration including one charity School and 2 ECR at Dagochang and Barishog and 30 Schools under Thimphu Thromde including 12 Private Schools, out of which 5 are Community Primary School, 8 Lower Secondary Schools and 6 Middle Secondary Schools, 2 Higher Secondary Schools and 12 Private School with total of 25,334 students and 1,177 teacher as of December 2011. It also has 16 NFE centre in the rural with total of 435 learners and 23 instructors and 12 centre in the city with 402 learners and 33 instructors.

As of 2011, all eight Gewogs have access to mobile network. The Dzongkhag also has one Mini Hydel.
