



Background

Samdrup Jongkhar Dzongkhag lies in the South Eastern part of Bhutan bordering the Indian states of Assam and Aranachal Pradesh. The Dzongkhag has a total area of approximately 1,877.67 Sq. Km. The major portion of the Dzongkhag falls within the sub-tropical belt with elevations ranging from 200-3500 meters above sea level.

The Dzongkhag Administration unit comprises of 2 Dungkhags namely; Samdrupchhoeling and Jhomotsangkha and has 11 Gewogs viz; Orong, Deothang, Gomdar, Wangphu, Phuntshothang, Pemathang, Martshala, Samrang, Serthi, Lauri and Langchenphu.

Since 2001, the Dzongkhag has a reliable electricity supply from Kurichu Hydro Power Station, Mongar. The Drungkhag Administration Office and Gewog centers are connected with telecommunication facilities. Existence of such infrastructures and with normalization of security situation, the Dzongkhag has significantly improved its socio-economic development.

With large fertile plain area, rich mineral deposits and sub-tropical climate, the Dzongkhag has high potential for agricultural and economic activities. It is also the gateway and commercial hub for other five eastern Dzongkhags with many industrial and mining operations.
