The Annual Dzongkhag Statistics of Paro is the second in the series of publications. It attempts to provide comprehensive statistics of Paro Dzongkhag and will be published annually.

The report contains statistics on demographic and socio-economic, environment, culture, local governance and infrastructures of the Dzongkhag. The statistical data for this publication are collected and compiled from various sectors and through primary sources.

We hope that this report will serve as a source of information and guiding tool for micro-level planning and decision-making in the Dzongkhag. Statistics office, Paro would like to thank and acknowledge the support and cooperation of all sector heads concerned for providing timely information for this report. Without their support, this publication would not have been possible. Through this initiative, we also hope that the maintenance of sectoral information and updation in the Dzongkhag will become more systematic and efficient henceforth.

Since this report is the second publication and with information source being from numerous sectors, we expect there may be certain deficiencies in terms of coverage and updation. However, there will be continuous efforts made to improve its coverage and quality in our future publications. Your comments and suggestions in this regard will be highly appreciated.

Background

Paro Dzongkhag, encompassing a total area of 1,293.2 Sq.Km with an altitude 2500 meters above the sea level, has ten Gewogs, namely Dogar, Dopshari, Doteng, Hungrel, Lamgong, Luni, Naja, Shaba, Tsento and Wangchang. It is bordered by China in the North, Thimphu dzongkhag in the east, Haa Dzongkhag in the west and Chhukha dzongkhag in the south.

As per the PHCB 2005, Paro has 7,118 households and a total population of 36,433 out of which 33,501 live in the rural areas. The projected population for 2011, based on PHCB 2005, is 40,490.

A favorable terrain condition coupled with easy road accessibility has brought manifold changes in the socio-economic development of Paro. It is also considered as one of the prosperous Dzongkhag in the country.

The main source of income for the people of Paro are from paddy, apples, vegetables, livestock farms and tourism related activities. The sales of Cordyceps in the northern part of Tsento gewog are also supplementing their income.

The Dzongkhag has a total road network of 438Km including 139.4Km of National Highway and 262Km of Farm roads. It has one hospital, three BHUs and 27 Outreach Clinic. It has a total of 23 Schools, out of which four are Community Primary Schools, three Primary Schools, six Lower Secondary Schools, four Middle Secondary Schools, two Higher Secondary Schools and four private schools (one primary and three higher secondary Schools) with a total of 10,917 students and 501 teachers as of December 2011. It also has 21 NFE Centers and 300 NFE Learners and 21 NFE Instructors. The Paro College of Education has 853 trainees and 64 teachers as of 31st October 2011.

As of September 2011, a total of 1,800 households have direct fixed telephone line connections and 37,581 B-mobile subscribers. The only international airport in the country is located in Paro Dzongkhag.
