

Background

Gasa Dzongkhag lies in the extreme northwest of the country. It is bordered by Punakha Dzongkhag towards southeast, Thimphu Dzongkhag in the southwest, Wangdue Phodrang Dzongkhag in the east and international boundary with Tibet Autonomous region of China. The Dzongkhag has an area of 3117.74 Sq Km, covering 11% of the total area of the whole country. The altitude ranges from 1500 to 4500 meters above sea level.

It experiences climate conditions ranging from temperate to alpine with extremely cold winters, and short and pleasant summers. During winters, upper Gasa, Laya and Lunana experience heavy snow fall which keep them snow bound as the mountain passes become inaccessible. It receives an average annual rainfall 2,000mm.

Initially, Gasa was a Dungkhag under Punakha Dzongkhag. In 1992 during the seventh Five Year Plan, it was upgraded and established as a separate Dzongkhag. Currently, the Dzongkhag is administratively supported by four Gewog namely Goenkhatoe, Goenkhamae, Laya and Lunana. Lunana is the furthest and most remote Gewog amongst the four. Gasa has a total of 3116 (PHCB, 05) registered population.

The people of Gasa generally speak Dzongkha with a distinctive accent. People of Laya and Lunana Gewogs also speak their local dialect and have their own unique dress.

The whole Dzongkhag falls under the Jigme Dorji National Park and is the habitat for different species of birds and animals like the takin, musk deer, blue sheep, snow leopard, red pandas, raven, wild pheasants, snow pigeons, red billed cough, Himalayan black bear, tiger, black necked crane etc. The Dzongkhag has about 33% its land area under forest cover, out of which about 35% is scrubs forest, 27% under fir forest, 15% under mixed conifer forest, 4% under broad leafed forest and the rest as tsamdro.

Gasa hold significant and strategic records in the history of Bhutan due to its relations and connections with the visit of Lama Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyel to Bhutan. Its relation as the patron and host to the unifier of Bhutan, Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyel earns it a special place and accord in the socio-political history of Bhutan.
